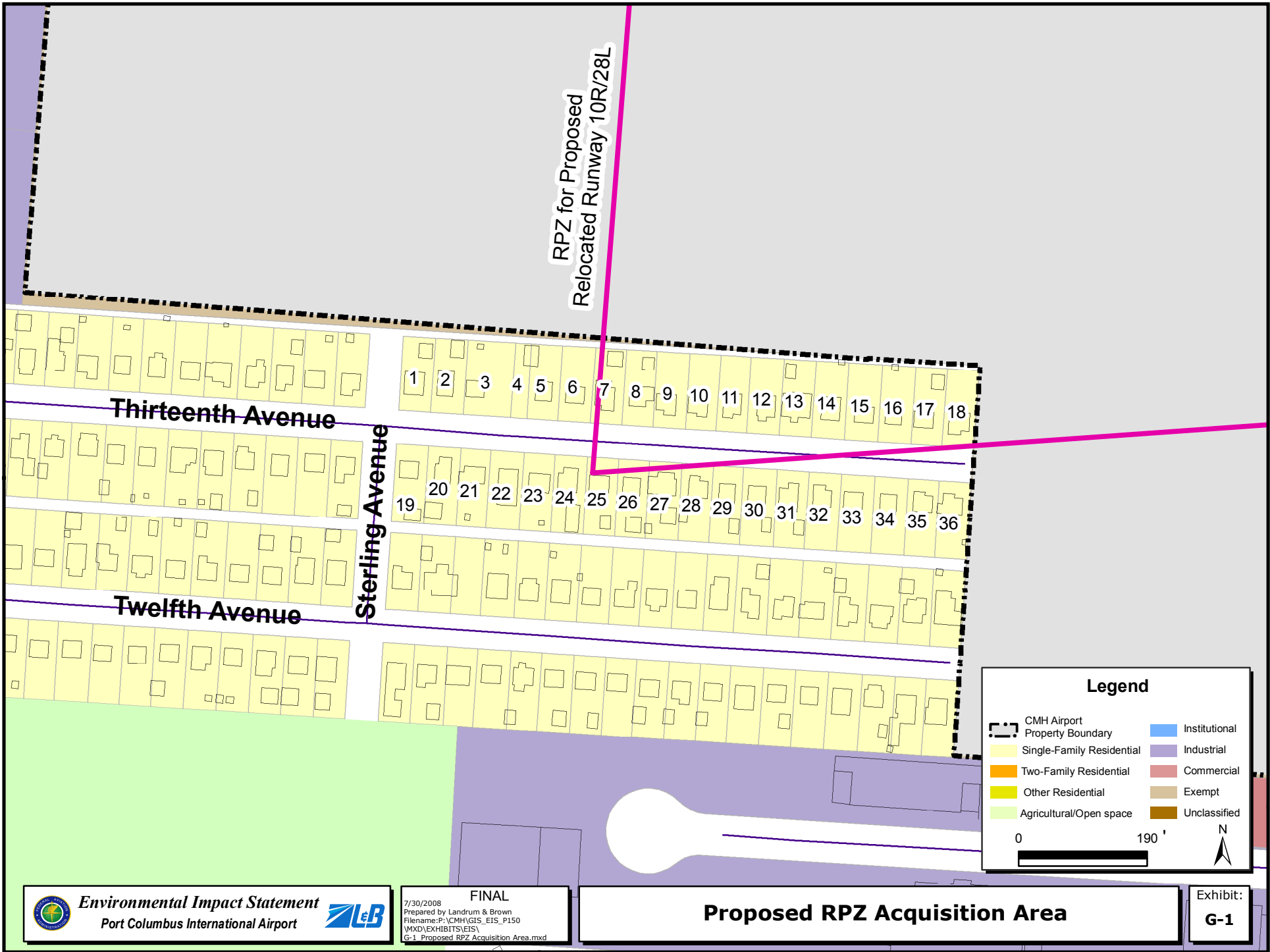


APPENDIX G PROPOSED PROPERTY ACQUISITION

This appendix provides information on the proposed acquisition of property related to the development alternatives assessed in this Environmental Impact Statement. Exhibit G-1 and Table G-1 identify the parcels and the property owners of the 36 properties within the proposed acquisition area. Following the exhibit and table is information regarding the affected property owner and resident meeting that was held on January 24th, 2008. Since the meeting on January 24th, 2008, the CRAA has made 25 offers to identified homeowners with 12 accepting the offers. To date, eight properties have been purchased.

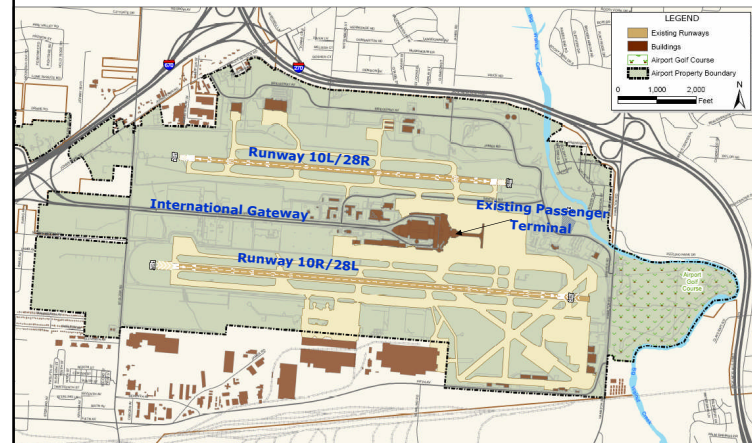

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II. Project Overview - Background

CRAA has proposed to relocate the south runway (10R/28L)

- Relocated runway would be 702 feet to the south of the existing runway
- The existing south runway would be converted into a taxiway
- The relocation is needed to make room for a new passenger terminal at the airport
- The FAA is conducting an Environmental Impact Statement to ensure compliance with environmental regulations
- The EIS is not complete and therefore the decision to build the relocated runway has not been made at this time
 - It is anticipated that the FAA will make a decision on the project in April 2009

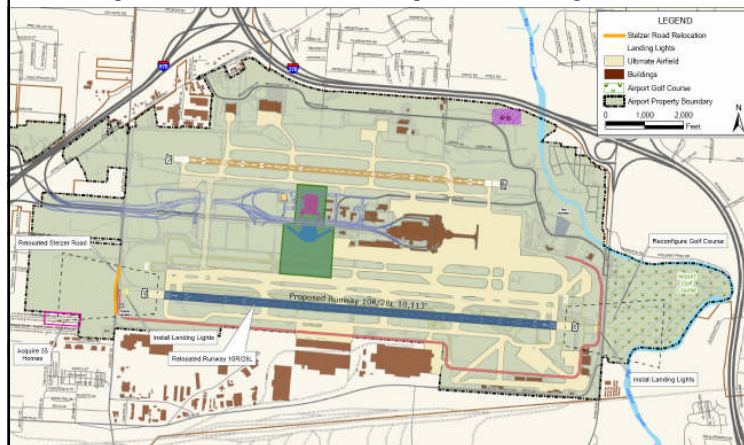

Runway Protection Zones (RPZ)

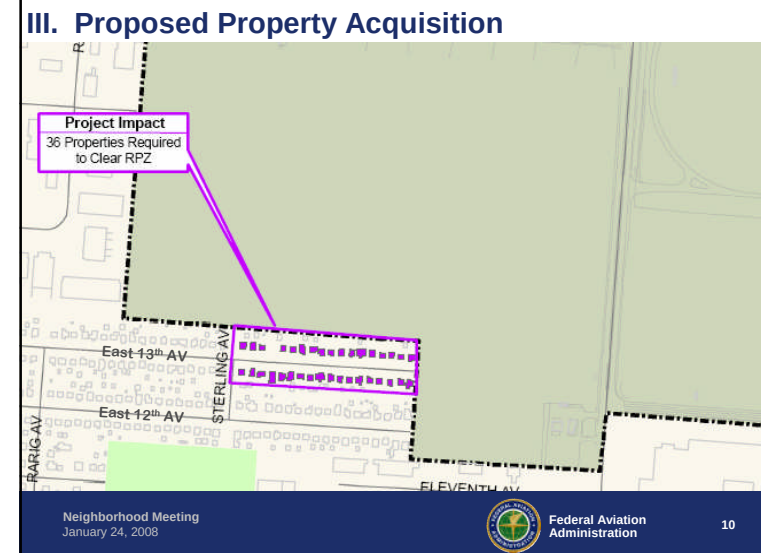
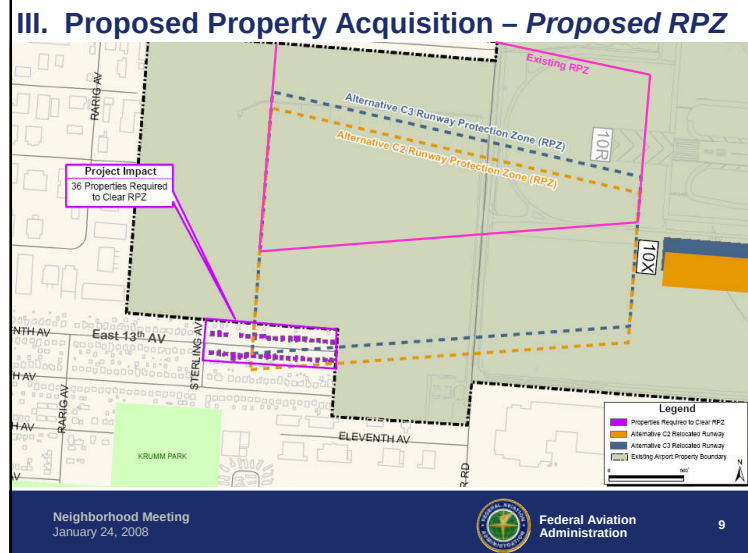
- The FAA has established design standards for runway construction
 - Beyond the end of a runway, a Runway Protection Zone must be developed
 - The purpose is to protect arriving and departing aircraft from obstacles
 - The size and distance of the RPZ from the runway end is dependent on the size of aircraft using the runway
 - Obstacles located within an RPZ and land uses that promote human congregation (e.g., residential uses) should be removed
- The Columbus Regional Airport Authority is responsible for complying with these requirements

Impact of Relocating RPZ

- 36 properties would be acquired to clear the RPZ and the remainder of the block
- East 13th Avenue, east of Sterling Avenue would be closed
- The airport would install a fence and/or earthen berm to ensure safety and to minimize noise impacts

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IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Title Research

- Public records review to identify ownerships and all interests in each property
- Title Agents will identify any defects in the history of title transfer and all outstanding debts, liens, etc.
- Similar to the title search and insurance obtained when you buy or sell property in a traditional transaction.
- Ensures "fee ownership" of the property



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Appraisal and Valuation

- Each property is appraised by a State Certified Appraiser to establish "Fair Market Value" (FMV)
- The appraiser must arrive at the value that you would receive if you were to sell your home on the open market
- Owners will be contacted by the appraiser prior to the appraisal
- Owners can be with the appraiser during the property inspection



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Appraisal Review

- An outside State Certified Appraiser will review each appraisal to insure technical compliance with prevailing laws
- The review appraiser considers the validity and soundness of the value and adjustments that were made by the appraiser
- This step is created to insure that appraisals are fair, reasonable, and technically sound



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Property Owner/Agent Communications

- Property owners will be assigned a property agent to assist during the acquisition process.
- After the appraisal, the property agent will meet with each owner and explain:
 - The property appraisal and the reasoning behind the valuation
 - All legal documents related to the transfer of the property
 - Rights under the federal and state laws which govern the acquisition process
- The property agent will be available throughout the acquisition process to communicate with the owner and CRAA



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Two Categories

- **Owner occupants** – residents who own and live in the home
- **Tenant occupants** – residents who rent the home that they occupy
- A relocation agent will be assigned to each resident to assist throughout the relocation process



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Benefits Exist for Owner Occupants

- Replacement Housing Payments – May provide additional funds to insure each owner will have the opportunity to purchase equal or better comparable housing for relocation
- Additional benefits include:
 - Moving Cost Payments
 - Incidental Expenses to the Relocation
 - Increased Interest Expenses



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Replacement Housing Payment Example

- Property appraises for \$50,000
- In order to purchase an equal replacement home, the owner will have to spend \$60,000 based on a home identified and available for purchase at the time of the notification of eligibility
- The maximum amount of replacement housing payment would be \$10,000 provided the owner purchases a home for \$60,000 or greater



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Benefits Exist for Each Tenant Occupant

- Rent Supplement Payments - May provide additional funds to insure each tenant will have the opportunity to rent equal to or better comparable housing for relocation
- Moving Cost Payments
- Tenants may also elect to purchase a new home and the Rent Supplement Payment can be utilized as Down Payment Assistance



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Rent Supplement Payment Example

- A tenant pays \$400/month for rent and utilities
- In order to rent an equal replacement home, the tenant will have to spend \$500/month based on a home identified and available for rent at the time of the notification of eligibility
- The maximum amount of rent supplement payment would be \$4,200 provided the tenant rents a home for \$500 or greater
- $(\$500 - \$400) \times 42 \text{ Months} = \$4,200$

Critical Relocation Information

- Only persons residing in the property at the time of the notice of intent to acquire are eligible for assistance
- Benefits are based on money spent in the relocation. You will not receive the benefit for use on other unrelated expenses
- Communicate regularly with your relocation agent to insure that you don't commit to a situation that could compromise benefits
- To be eligible for benefits, relocation housing must be decent, safe and sanitary



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Closing and Recording

- Upon execution of the purchase contract, CRAA will begin the production of payment, subject to the terms of the contract
- A closing agent will prepare the deed for transfer and determine the necessary mortgage payoffs, tax pro rations, etc
- The closing agent will contact the owner to schedule the closing
- All documents will be executed and funds will be disbursed at the closing



IV. Overview of Acquisition Process

Land Acquisition Schedule

- Assuming a favorable decision from the FAA, CRAA will begin acquisition in the summer of 2009
- An individual acquisition can take 6 months.
- Acquiring all 36 parcels may take up to 24 months.
- If property owners do not want to wait and are willing to sell now, the process can begin now
 - ***CRAA requests that you contact ME Companies directly if you would like to start the process now***

Neighborhood Meeting

What is the Purpose of Tonight's Meeting?

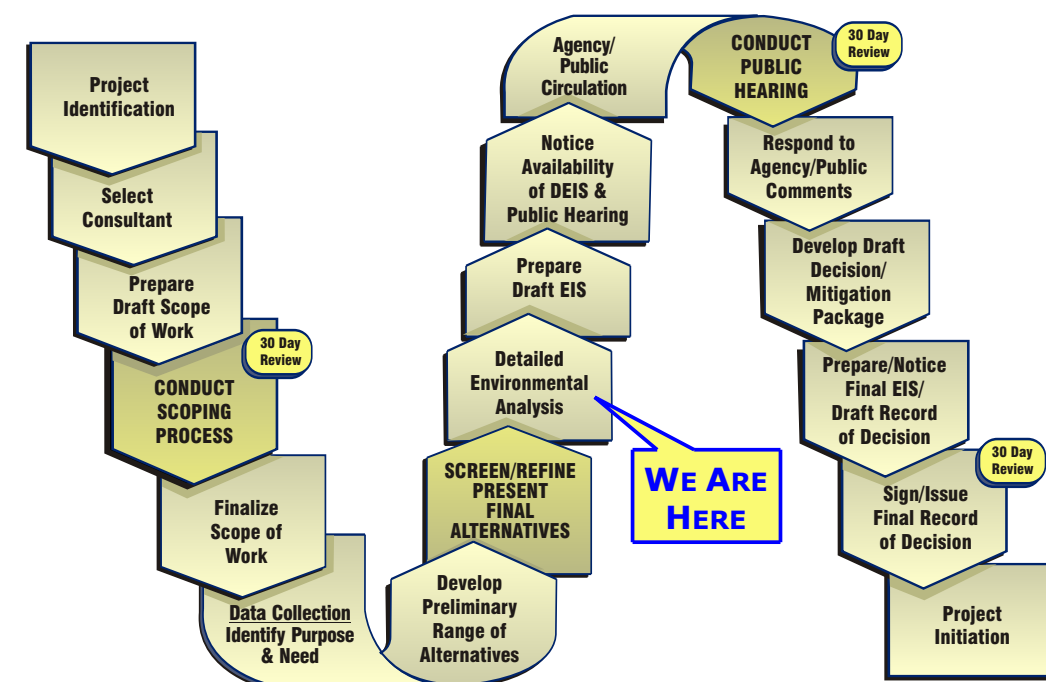
Tonight's meeting is to discuss the proposed land acquisition and resident relocation program associated with the proposed improvements being studied at the Port Columbus International Airport (CMH). The proposed improvements at CMH include the construction of a replacement for the airport's south runway (Runway 10R/28L), a new passenger terminal, and other support facilities. An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is currently being prepared to understand what the environmental impacts of this project are, including the impact to owners and residents of property located on East 13th Avenue, east of Sterling Avenue. The rest of this handout provides background information on the EIS process and specific information about the proposed improvements at CMH to accomplish the proposed runway development.

The EIS Process

Before development of any of the proposed projects can begin, they must undergo a detailed review to ensure that they are in compliance with environmental regulations. This process is called an EIS. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is responsible for ensuring that airport development projects, such as those proposed by the Columbus Regional Airport Authority (CRAA) for CMH, comply with the applicable environmental regulations. The potential environmental impacts of the proposed development are assessed in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969. This body of federal laws is intended to protect the nation's environment.

In addition to public comments, local, state and federal agencies also provide input on the proposed development. Coordination with the agencies occurs throughout the EIS study process.

The following illustration graphically shows the EIS process.



Purpose and Need

One of the most important elements of the EIS process is to develop the Purpose and Need Statement. The Purpose and Need Statement concisely summarizes why each element of the proposed development program is needed. It serves as the basis upon which all alternatives to the proposed projects are evaluated. Alternatives that do not meet the Purpose and Need are excluded from more detailed environmental review. The purpose of the proposed development being evaluated in this EIS is to meet the following needs:

- The need to rehabilitate Runway 10R/28L
- The need to provide long-term airfield capacity and delay reduction during peak operating periods
- The need to provide sufficient terminal capacity to accommodate projected passenger levels
- The need to provide sufficient ancillary facilities to support the projected increase in air transportation demand
- The need to enhance the human environment by reducing noise impacts on the surrounding communities

Projects Being Considered in the EIS

The runway relocation and the terminal development are the primary projects being considered in the EIS. There are also other projects that will need to be completed to support these two facilities. The list below includes all of the projects being assessed in the EIS.

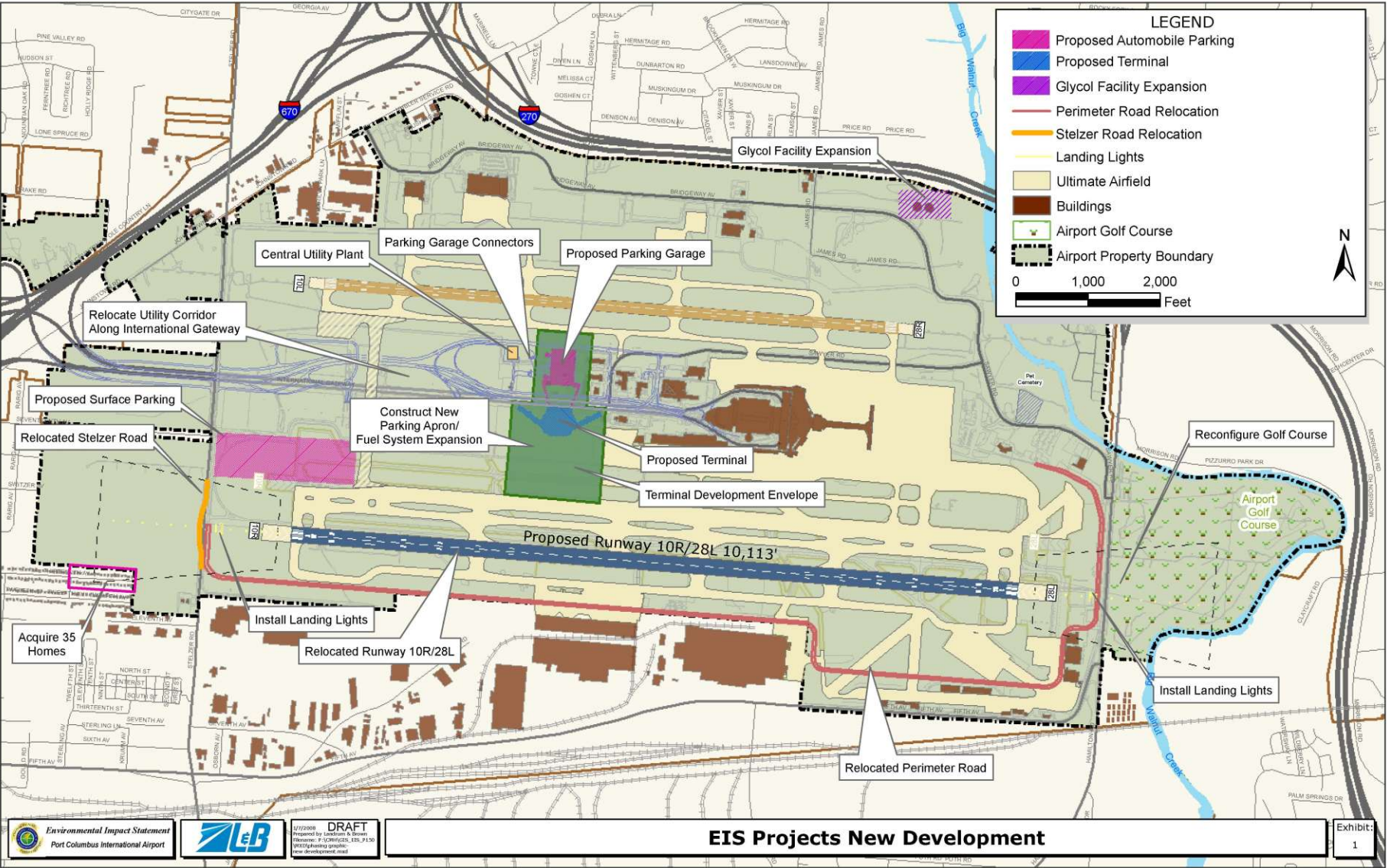
- Construction of a replacement runway, 10,113 feet long, located 702 feet south of the existing Runway 10R/28L
- Construction of additional taxiways to support the replacement runway
- Proposed terminal development (defined as a development area that will encompass Phase I of the CRAA terminal development program) examining the number of gates; approximate square footage of the structure; number of levels, and if any are underground, approximate curb frontage; and the number of passengers that the terminal would accommodate
- Necessary navigational aids (NAVAIDS) to obtain a CAT II approach
- Proposed aviation-related development
- Associated roadway relocations and construction
- Parking improvements (including both surface lots and parking garage)
- Property acquisition and relocation of residences, businesses, as necessary
- Development of air traffic operational procedures for the replacement runway
- Proposed noise abatement actions (to be assessed in a separate Part 150 Noise Compatibility Study)

Alternatives Being Reviewed

In compliance with NEPA, one of the requirements of an EIS is that a full range of alternatives to the proposed project is also to be considered. Information about the range of alternatives being considered in the EIS is available at tonight's meeting. These alternatives are screened to determine if they meet the airport's needs based upon their environmental impacts, operational advantages and disadvantages, and cost. The most viable alternatives are carried forward for detailed environmental review. The range of alternatives that has been developed considers no-action, off-site alternatives, and on-site alternatives to the sponsor's proposed project. The no-action alternative would include no changes to the existing airport. This would not meet the Purpose and Need for the project, but according to NEPA regulations must be carried forward for detailed analysis. The no-action alternative serves as the baseline upon which other alternatives are evaluated for environmental impacts.

Off-site Alternatives

Off-site alternatives include the consideration of the use of other airports, other modes of transportation, and telecommunications. The use of other airports considers the feasibility of moving air traffic to another airport in the area to meet the needs of the users of CMH. The potential to move air traffic to Dayton International, Rickenbacker International, Bolton Field Airport, and The Ohio State University Airport was analyzed, but none would be capable of accommodating the additional activity without major expansion. Similarly, the use of other modes of transportation was analyzed, but none was capable of reducing the need at CMH.



On-site Alternatives

The FAA has developed and evaluated on-site runway alternatives. Evaluation criteria include the ability of the alternative to meet the purpose and need for the project as well as operational, environmental and cost considerations. Based upon the results of initial screening, alternatives are either carried forward in the EIS process for further environmental review or are removed from further evaluation.

Runway Development Alternatives

The following six alternatives for runway development were evaluated:

- **No- Action**
- Reconstruct Runway 10R/28L in place
- Reconstruct Runway 10R/28L in current location and relocate Runway 10L/28R 700 feet to the north
- Relocate Runway 10R/28L 1,500 feet to the south
- **Relocate Runway 10R/28L 800 feet to the south**
- **Relocate Runway 10R/28L 702 feet to the south**

The three alternatives shown in bold are being carried forward for further evaluation.

Terminal Development Alternatives

The FAA has independently evaluated four terminal development envelope alternatives. The evaluation for these alternatives was primarily based upon whether or not the required terminal development could be accommodated within the available space.

The following four terminal development envelope alternatives were evaluated:

- **No- Action**
- Maximize existing terminal
- **Construct a new terminal in the south airfield**
- Construct a new terminal in the north airfield

The two alternatives shown in bold are being carried forward for further environmental evaluation.

Information on all of the alternatives that have been developed and reviewed is available at tonight's meeting.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q.** By whom and how is the offer for my property determined?
- A.** Your offer is determined by the Columbus Regional Airport Authority (CRAA), which concurs with the Fair Market Value based on an approved appraisal.
- Q.** What if I do not agree with the amount offered for my property?
- A.** You should share with the ME Companies' representative any property sales information and/or valuation data that would verify that your compensation should be more than the amount offered (a supportable counter offer). Property owners can also obtain their own appraisal, which CRAA will review for reasonableness. It is the sincere desire of CRAA to offer you the full fair market value for your property. CRAA is required by law to offer full fair market value for any property it must acquire in conjunction with an Airport Improvement Program (AIP) or other federally funded project.
- Q.** What does "full fair market value" mean?
- A.** Full Fair Market Value is the amount a willing buyer would pay a willing seller for the property on the open market, with neither the buyer nor seller acting under duress. What this means is CRAA will pay you the value you would expect to receive if you were to put your property up for sale on the open market. In most instances this value is computed by determining what similar properties in your neighborhood have recently been selling for.
- Q.** What do I receive payment for?
- A.** Property owners are compensated for all real estate needed.
- Q.** What happens first? When will someone contact me?
- A.** You will receive an introductory letter from CRAA. After a title report and appraisal are completed, ME Companies will contact you to set up an appointment to go over the project plans and CRAA's offer.
- Q.** What is the time frame for payment? How long until I get my money?
- A.** Once the purchase agreement is signed, it will take between 8 and 12 weeks to schedule the closing. This is necessary to complete inspections, surveys and other paperwork. Funds will be distributed after signing the necessary instruments for transfer of property at closing,
- Q.** What relocation benefits are available?
- A.** Relocation benefits are available to assist in your moving or relocating to another property. They can apply to home, farm, or business acquisitions. The amount is calculated based on a number of factors. A representative from ME Companies will give you a detailed explanation of all of your eligible relocation benefits.
- Q.** Will I be compensated for loss of business?
- A.** Under Federal and State Laws, loss of income is non-compensatory.

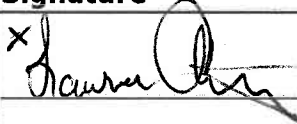
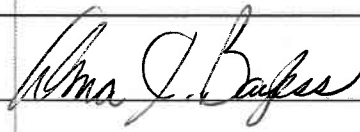

Question and Answer Session:

Q: If we wait and end up being the last house to be bought, will there be less money available?

A: The same process will be used no matter the order the homes are bought. There is not a set pool of money that will run out.

Q: You aren't going to find us a house on 12th Avenue are you?

A: The Federal government requires us to find comparable housing. The Federal definition of comparable housing defines what benefits a specific property is eligible for. The definition of comparable is not the same for everyone. It is not required the homeowner choose to move to the homes that were used as comparable.

Q: Is it possible for the owner to sell the property to the CRAA and pay rent to continue to live in the home until it is torn down?

A: It is not in the CRAA's interest to be landlords. They would prefer to sign an agreement with the owner to purchase the home and not close and purchase the home until the homeowner is ready to move out.

Q: Will the appraisals be based on the other homes on 13th that have been purchased?

A: No, the other homes that were/are purchased will not be used in the appraisal process.

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JANUARY 24, 2008

7:00 P.M.

Q: If a person would like to upgrade is there only a certain amount of money to do so?

A: The comparable housing sets the amount of money eligible to be received for each homeowner.

Q: What if we decide to sell now and the airport project doesn't happen in 2009?

A: You have a new house and the airport owns your property.

Q: If we say we want to sell tonight is it set in stone?

A: No one has to sell until 2009, if the project is approved.

A (Bernie Meleski): If you are in a hardship situation you can wait or if you want to move now you have that option.

Q: If we decide to sell how long do we have to get out?

A: No specific time frame set right now. After you get the official relocation letter in the mail you will have 90 days to move.

Q: If we wait until 2009 will we still have 90 days?

A: Yes

Q: We are concerned about using appraisals from the 13th Avenue neighborhood because all of the homes were a depressed sell.

A: The appraiser considers all of the conditions of a neighborhood to confirm the condition of the sales. If the all of the sales were depressed the appraiser will factor that into the appraisal.

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7:00 P.M.

Q: The values of the homes are down in the current market so the value of the homes is to the advantage of the CRAA?

A: Selling in a depressed market is the same as buying in a depressed market.

Q: Can the airport use eminent domain?

A: If after the EIS and ROD you still have not agreed on the fair market value of your home. The CRAA can file suit and will need to demonstrate the property is worth taking. You can present what you feel is the fair market value and the CRAA will do the same. It will then be up to a jury to decide the final value. A small number do end up going to trial (~1%).

Q: Who do the relocation agents represent? Who is paying them?

A: They represent no one. The CRAA pays them. They make sure all laws are followed.

Q: How is land included in the appraisal? We have 1 and a half lots.

A: Land is considered in the appraisal and the appraisal will factor in the additional land.

Q: How do you determine the value is fair if it is based on other houses in the neighborhood that do not have the same upgrades?

A: First see the appraisal and then if you don't agree you can always get your own appraisal done.
